How IODE Ontario Services Spent Their Summer Vacation

During the summer break, Provincial Services continued to collect donations, purchase items, sort, pack and deliver.

In June, five parcels were mailed to Northern communities. During August, 23 parcels were mailed to nursing stations and schools in Northern Ontario. Also in August, OPP Indigenous Team members picked up two boxes for nursing clinics, seven boxes for schools, as well as 12 bags of clothing for OPP Officers to distribute in communities where they work and there is a need.

Clothing, footwear, personal hygiene items and supplies for art kits were purchased by Services Committee members. Co-Officer Virginia Reade arranged convenient meeting locations with members of the public to pick up their donations. She also delivered several parcels to OPP in Parry Sound on her way to a cottage for a few days of well-deserved rest.

The Christmas packing in the first week of November consists of providing gifts for young children to early teens. Finding something to send to young teen boys is always difficult. In August, Services sent letters to major Canadian sports organizations to see if they would be willing to provide new ball caps/toques for this age group. No response has been received to date.

CANADA POST FREE SHIPPING

If someone in your chapter has a Small Business Account with Canada Post your chapter could take advantage of the following. During the month of October, Canada Post offers free shipping every Tuesday of 2 parcels, maximum of 5 kg (12 lbs) each. This could be useful if your chapter has an adopted school. Please note it is 1 free parcel within Canada and 1 to the United States. To find out how it works check the Canada Post website.

On June 23rd, in recognition of Queen Elizabeth II's seventy-year reign, Laurentian hosted an IODE Platinum Jubilee (Inside) Garden Party at Elmwood Girl's School in Rockcliffe, funded in part by a grant from Canadian Heritage. Guest speakers included: the British High Commissioner, a Federal MP, the City Councilor for the Ward, Elmwood's Head of School and the Executive Director of the Inuuqatigiit Centre for Inuit Children, Youth and Families (our designated primary recipient of funds raised 2022-23). One hundred and sixty guests enjoyed an afternoon of socializing. Thanks to the generous donations of our guests, Laurentian was able to present a cheque for \$5000 to the Inuuqatigiit Centre on August 9th.





On September 10th, after many months of planning, the involvement of 125 volunteers, the IODE Laurentian New Edinburgh Street Fest was launched, a welcome outing for covid-weary participants! It was a multi-faceted event, and again, designed as a fund-raiser for the Inuuqatigiit Centre for Inuit Children, Youth and Families. Events included: throat singers at the Opening Ceremony, a self-guided walking tour with doorstep interpreters at select sites, speaker and music programs at two churches,




veranda concerts, a bake sale, dance demonstrations, an art show, horse and carriage rides, an antique car show, vendors and a beer and wine tent. The ticket price of \$30 included a beautiful souvenir history booklet of New Edinburgh, complete with map and photos. 




