

## **IODE Ontario: The Beginning**

In February, we celebrated Founders' Day, the formation of IODE Canada in 1900 and Mrs. Margaret Polson Murray as its Founder. However, do you know when IODE Ontario was formed? Here is some background.

By 1918, there were 270 primary chapters in Ontario with over 10,000 members. Many IODE chapters formed during the World War 1 supported our Armed Forces and the families that they left behind.

In Ontario, there were 7 municipal chapters in existence to alleviate the work of the National Chapter. They were: Hamilton Municipal formed in 1902, Kingston Municipal 1906, London Municipal 1911, St. Catharine's Municipal 1912, Ottawa Municipal 1918, Toronto Municipal 1912, and Stratford Municipal 1917. By 1919, the Brantford Municipal and Cornwall Municipal were formed. At that time a municipal chapter acted as an intermediary chapter which gathered reports for the primary chapter, sending one main copy to IODE Canada. They also coordinated efforts of the primary chapter, giving a greater impact to the community through major projects such as hospitals and cenotaphs. All these chapters reported directly to National. A provincial chapter was needed to spread the workload and to unite the chapters in Ontario.

In 1919, a ballot to vote for the formation of the Provincial Chapter of Ontario was sent to all chapters within the province. A meeting of representatives of Municipal and Primary chapters was held in Hamilton on February 6, 1920. The members agreed to apply for a Provincial Charter, which was granted on April 23, 1920.

It was established that the Provincial Headquarters would be in Hamilton. Provincial Chapter President Margaret Gage Burkholder, (Mrs. Harry F.) from Hamilton was a National Councillor since 1918 and had a Hamilton Chapter named in her honour in 1916. She was the first Provincial President who served from 1920-1928.

Mary H. Malcolmson (Mrs. A. H.), Services, St. Catharines

Miss Wilhelmia Gordon, Education Secretary, Kingston

Margaret Leitch (Mrs. A.W.), Public Relations and Junior Chapters, Hamilton

Bessie Mulock (Mrs. M. J.), Echoes Secretary, St. Catharines

Miss Ethel Raymond, Standard Bearer, Brantford

The Provincial Chapter provided a great impetus to recruiting and by the end of the first year, four Municipal (Chatham Municipal 1920 and Sault St. Marie 1920, Windsor Municipal 1921 and St. Thomas 1921) and 17 Primary Chapters were bestowed.

The first Annual Meeting of IODE Ontario was held at the Royal Connaught Hotel in Hamilton. There were over 500 members present to hear the reports and to be billeted by the Hamilton members.

## Prepared for IODE Ontario

Thank you for your leading support of Canada's National Ballet School through the Student Partner Program. We are pleased to present your annual Student Profile—a chance for your partnered student to share some of their experiences and achievements from the past school year.

Last year, NBS welcomed over 160 students to the Professional Ballet Program. Each of them was admitted on the basis of their talent alone, and nearly 80% required financial assistance to cover the costs associated with tuition, residence, travel, and other expenses. Nearly \$3.2 million in student financial assistance was needed last year. The Student Partner Program covers a significant amount of this cost. The balance is covered by endowed funds, the annual NBS gala, and other operating revenue.

At NBS, excellence, access, and inclusion fuel our belief in sharing the transformational power of dance to change lives for the better. **Thank you** for embodying this conviction through your generous commitment, which gives talented young artists every opportunity to discover, develop, and pursue their full potential.

If you are a member of Facebook or other social media platforms and belong to a community page, remember to post your Chapters events and let everyone know what your Chapter is doing in your community.




