We can offer assistance in promoting your events and chapter activities by posting them on both our website www.iodeontario.ca and our Facebook page - IODE Ontario. Our Canadian Flag: A Symbol of Unity by Sheila M DeJaegher, IODE Ontario Standard Bearer

The flag of Canada was officially adopted on February 15, 1965. That day Honourable Maurice Bourget, Speaker of the Senate, added further symbolic meaning to the flag: "The flag is the symbol of the nation's unity, for it, beyond any doubt, represents all the citizens of Canada without distinction of race, language, belief or opinion."

I would like to remind all the chapter Standard Bearers to check your chapter's flags and to make sure they are in good shape. Perhaps it is time to purchase a new one. If your chapter has a floor standard, be sure to polish the brass on the pole. We recommend you purchase a small tin of *Brasso* at the hardware store or grocery store. Check your flags each month to be sure that they are ready in case of a service for a member or any other function that the floor standard might be needed.

The IODE Adopted Schools Program was initiated in 1923, to improve literacy among the children in remote Northern communities. Today IODE Chapters and individual members continue to support schools, classrooms and teachers in Northern Ontario.

Through this program, IODE chapters and members thrive to provide some measure of equal opportunity for children in remote areas. The schools are very appreciative of the items they receive as confirmed by Principals to whom I spoke with this summer.



At the 2016 Provincial Annual Meeting, the excitement after Speaker Kyle Hill, Executive Director of *Teach For Canada* (TFC), (a non-profit charitable organization which prepares teachers to work in remote First Nations communities), completed his address, was profound. *Teach For Canada*'s goal of having long-term commitment from their teachers could possibly help facilitate communication with our chapters.

Toronto Legacy Committee: Assisting Students in Need

Prior to the IODE Toronto Municipal Chapter disbandment, the IODE Toronto Legacy Fund was established. The IODE Toronto Legacy Committee oversees all programs supported by this fund under the jurisdiction of IODE Ontario. The Committee is comprised of a minimum of five Toronto area members, the Toronto Area Vice President and the Provincial President.

Through the generosity of the W. Garfield Weston Foundation, the IODE Toronto Legacy Committee is able to assist a carefully chosen number of grade 12 students needing financial assistance in the Toronto area (GTA). Because of this partnership and funds received for the IODE Tine Stewart Bursary, the Toronto Legacy Committee, this year is able to support twenty students with a monthly allowance at thirteen schools in the Toronto District School Board. The W. Garfield Weston Foundation Bursary and the IODE Tine Stewart Bursary is valued at \$25,000 annually.


Furthermore, a portion from the W. Garfield Weston Foundation enables us to purchase Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) tickets for students under the jurisdiction of the Toronto District School Board. Guidance Counselors and/or Social Workers identify students unable to afford TTC tickets. This assists students to attend school regularly and allows the students to more effectively reach their goals. The TTC Funding is valued at \$5,000 annually.





2016 Provincial Annual Meeting Highlights

The winner of the 2016 IODE Jean Throop Book Award is.... Finding Winnie



I am sure everyone has a fond memory of the famous bear, Winnie-the-Pooh. Whether it was read to us as children or whether we have read or are reading it to our children, grandchildren or even our great grandchildren, Winnie-the-Pooh is an icon in children's literature. Author, Lindsay Mattick, has written a wonderful book entitled "Finding Winnie". Lindsay has a unique connection with Winnie. She is the great granddaughter of Captain Harry Colebourn, the Canadian soldier and veterinarian who purchased the Winnipeg bear and took him overseas during World War I. Of course, that cute brown bear became the well known and well loved Winnie of the Winnie-the-

Pooh stories. Lindsay's beautifully written story, told in the book to her son Cole, tells the story of Winnie's journey from Winnipeg, to becoming part of the soldiers' lives and to eventually the London Zoo and becom-



ing A.A. Milne's Winnie-the-Pooh. The beautiful and delicate illustrations by Sophie Blackall complement and enhance the telling of the story. Accompanying the story is a collection of historical photographs and journal entries of Captain Colebourn. They reminds the reader of how history, fiction and life intersect. The archival information is a strong reminder to all of us to treasure our family stories and make sure they are recorded and passed on to our future generations.

2016 IODE Ontario Police Community Relations Award recipient:

Sergeant Kevin Morgan, Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), Highway Safety Division



Sergeant Morgan began his career in 1991 and was first posted to Downsview Detachment where he spent 18 years. Since 2009, he has served the HSD 407 Detachment in various capacities such as Team Leader, Operations Manager and Acting Detachment Commander.

In the past six years, Sergeant Morgan has helped the native youth overcome barriers to playing organized sports by collecting and distributing gently used sporting equipment for their use. Each year, he would either take the long drive to the remote needy communities, or he would arrange air transportation to deliver the equipment to those regions.

Sergeant Morgan is commended for building positive relationships between the OPP and the native communities. Nearly \$250,000 worth of sporting equipment has been shipped to Northern Reserves over the past five years. This initiative is a great way to reach out and support the young people in the First Nation Reserves, helping build their confidence and self-esteem through sports.

At the 2016 Provincial Annual Meeting, we were honoured to present Sergeant Kevin Morgan of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Highway Safety Division (HSD) with the IODE Police Community Relations Award for his exemplary work and dedication in providing used sporting equipment to hundreds of young people in the remote Northern Ontario First Nation communities.

As a reminder to chapter treasurers, **your fees are due February 28** of each year. Fees are required by the Provincial Chapter in order us to carry on our business and pay our bills. These funds enable us to maintain our cash flow in order that we meet our fiduciary obligations and pay our fund expenses and offices expenses. A healthy cash flow is necessary.

All chapters are required to complete the "Report of Primary Chapter Newly Elected Officers"; "Primary Chapter Membership List" (which includes all members addresses and email addresses) as soon as possible after your annual meeting. Remember all lists must be complete and match your remittance forms.

When chapter treasurers send in funds to the Provincial Office, please include a "Remittance Form for Primary Chapter Treasurer Under Provincial Jurisdiction". All funds received from your members must be recorded by the Provincial Office.

In an effort to complete the IODE Ontario member database, Helen Danby Provincial Archivist is compiling a list of all the women whom have been members since 1900 in Ontario. Helen has presently exhausted her resources and now is trying to recruit assistance to visit museums and libraries across the province that house IODE material.

Our records indicate that there were approximately 940 IODE Chapters in Ontario. We have listings for almost 500 chapters - some completed and some partial - with over 17,000 member names already. Your help in researching the members from early chapters would be most helpful.
